#### August 26, 2010, Chicago, IL

From August 24 - 29, twenty historic tall ships were welcomed at Chicago's Navy Pier as part of the 2010 Great Lakes Tall Ships Challenge®. Among them was the German vessel Roald Amundsen which made for a magnificent location for a networking reception hosted by GACCoM together with the Consulate General of the Federal Republic of Germany and the Goethe-Institut Chicago. More than 100 GACCoM members and friends enjoyed a beautiful summer night aboard the Roald Amundsen, filled with food and drinks, conversation, a raffle, and, of course, the great stories told by captain Hugo Bauer as well as a peek behind the scenes.

### GACCoM hosts its first food-themed German Business Delegation



#### July 19-23, 2010, Chicago, IL

As of 2010, the German American Chambers of Commerce (GACCs) act as the official export partner of the German food industry in the United States. A broad range of programs is being organized nationwide to support primarily small and medium-sized exporters in their market entry efforts.

GACCoM was the first chamber to welcome six renowned companies on a week-long Business

Delegation Trip to Chicago - this time with a focus on the Sweets and Snacks industry. An expert roundtable on Monday, July 19, was followed by a themed reception, 'A Taste of Germany,' an ideal opportunity for over 80 distinguished attendees to network with company representatives, sample the displayed products, and receive an introduction to the individual product portfolios. Over the course of the week, the delegation attended a total of over two dozen one-on-one meetings with potential American partners and completed several local storechecks including individual meetings with buyers as well as store managers.

### **Transatlantic Climate Bridge Conference on Renewable Energy & Emission Trading**



**July 21, 2010, Chicago, IL**

The German Federal Ministry for the Environment, Nuclear Safety, and Nature Conservation (BMU), together with GACCoM and the Consulate General of the Federal Republic of Germany held a 1/2 day conference to provide an update on the latest renewable policy developments from the US and Germany.

After a greeting by Onno Hueckmann, Consul General of the Federal Republic of Germany, the audience had the opportunity to hear top experts from governmental institutions from both sides of the Atlantic discuss similarities and differences between the US and Germany renewable energy policy, feed-in tariffs, wind energy, emission trading, carbon credits, and local perspectives. The panelists included Dr. Martin Schoepe, BMU (Head of Division, International and EU Affairs, Renewable Energy), who was joined by Howard Learner, Environmental Law and Policy Center; Sylvia Pilarsky-Grosch, German WindEnergy; Thomas Cushing, Chicago Climate Exchange; Michael Mehling, Ecologic Institute; and Jonathan Feipel, Illinois Department of Commerce & Economic Opportunity. This conference took place within the framework of the Transatlantic Climate Bridge, an initiative by the German Foreign Office and the BMU to foster transatlantic cooperation and partnership between Germany and the US in the climate and energy arena.

**June 21-25, 2010, Des Moines, IA**

The BioEnergy Business Delegation and Conference was an exciting opportunity for leading bioenergy companies and experts from both sides of the Atlantic to discuss opportunities for co-operation, as well as the trends in bioenergy technology.

The primary objective of the conference was to open a dialogue for partnership, to learn about synergies between German and US companies, and to further promote growth and success in the bioenergy industry.

The attendees of the BioEnergy Business Conference included system and component manufacturers, technology suppliers, developers, investors, public policy makers, and other stakeholders with an interest in the renewable energy field, especially bioenergy.

During a roundtable discussion prior to the main conference, the German bioenergy delegation was able to gather first-hand information about the U.S. bioenergy market from U.S. market and policy experts. Furthermore, the delegation visited various bioenergy research institutions and commercial facilities in the Des Moines and Cedar Rapids area, with more than seventy one-on-one meetings with potential US Business partners scheduled.

The BioEnergy Conference and Delegation took place under the framework of the Renewable Energies Export Initiative and was supported by the German Federal Ministry of Economics and Technology.
